May 19, Saturday – Missouri Armed Forces Day Parade in St. Peters. Rick Frierdich, event coordinator, provided a sign up sheet for those participating. Club members should meet at the Bob Evans Restaurant at Hwy 44 and 141 at 6 a.m. for breakfast. Cars will leave the restaurant at 7:15 a.m. to travel to the staging area. <u>Veterans Garden Stone</u> – Bill asked Rick Frierdich if he had information on getting an etched stone for the VA Garden. Rick will follow up on this.

New Business

<u>Correspondence</u> – Thank you notes were received from Shriners Hospital for the teddy bears donated by the club. A letter of thanks was also received from the Veterans Administration for the phone cards and gifts for the patients and the gardening for the Spinal Cord Unit.

<u>Club Brochure</u> – Bill presented the idea of putting together a club brochure. Ron Hagenow said that he is working with some ideas for a brochure. Rich Luebcke asked if the purpose of a brochure would be to let others know about the club and bring in new membership, keeping in mind the decision of the club to limit membership numbers per the standing by-laws. (At present there are 61 members. Current by-laws allow for a total membership of 100.)

Bill Dotson said that we don't want the club size to be too large to enjoy and that we want all members to know each other by name.

Club Pins – We still have 11 oval club pins. A minimum order of 250 is needed at cost of \$1.00 each. Pins could be used to hand out at club functions and as part of new member packets. Bill asked membership if they would want to get more pins. Armynta Craig mentioned that she had attended an Earnhardt event at which pins were given out and well received. It was suggested that pins be ordered prior to the Spearfish trip in July. Some questioned switching to a smaller lapel pin but it was thought that these would be more expensive. Bill Dotson suggested keeping the oval pin that we currently have. Carl Ballinger offered to check into the cost of lapel pins. Judy Dooley will find out the price of oval pins.

<u>Club Patches</u> – At present, we do not have a supply of club patches. Marty Dooley will get pricing/ordering information from Midwest Monograms.

<u>Midwest Monograms</u> – Charlie Miget said that representatives from Midwest Monograms will be present at the June 5th club meeting to take orders for club apparel. Charlie said that you can bring in your own shirt and Midwest will monogram it for you at a relatively low price. Payment for merchandise is due when the order is placed.

<u>Nametags</u> – Rich Luebcke reminded all members to wear their nametags to monthly meetings and events for the benefit of our new members.

<u>Corvette Caravan '09 Video</u> – Jerry Craig showed a video about the "Corvette Caravan '09". Carl Ballinger provided additional information on this exciting event. Carl is the Regional Chairman for the Caravan and will be coordinating plans for Missouri, Nebraska, and Kansas. Marty Dooley will be heading up the Missouri group.

The coast-to-coast caravan will bring Corvettes from around the country to the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky for the 15th anniversary celebration of the Museum. The event will take place Labor Day Week-end, 2009. Anyone with a Corvette can participate. Activities will include plant tours, road tours, and shopping. Participants will need to register each person in each vehicle. You will need to select which caravan you will be traveling with. 
