Submitted by Ruth Howard: Armynta gave me this recipe in 2011 and I made it for the winery run. Everyone loved them and requested the recipe.

Cranberry Tarts

1 (14.1 ounce) of box refrigerated pie crust – (2 rolls)

3/4 cup sugar

1/4 cp better, melted

2 large eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 cup dried cranberries

3/4 cup toffee bits

3/4 cup chopped walnuts

- 1. Preheat oven to 325°. Spray 24 mini muffin tins with non stick baking with flour.—I just use PAM without flour.
- 2. Roll out each pie crust just slightly larger and using a 23/4-inch round cutter, cut 12 ci4rcles from each pie crest. If necessary just re-roll curst. Press crusts into the bottom and up the sides of each cup of muffin pan.
- 3. In a medium bowl, combine sugar, melted butter, eggs and vanilla, whisking to combine. Stir in cranberries, toffee bits and walnuts. Spoon about 1 Tablespoon mixture into each prepared crust. Bake for 24 to 26 minutes or until lightly browned. Let cool in the pain for 10 minutes; remove tarts to wire racks to cool completely.

Ruth, be sure the crust come up over the top of each tin. Also use a rounded tablespoon of filling and then re-fill whatever is not used.

I have only transported these tarts once to Karen's house. What I did was to remove the tarts from the tin to a cooling rack then wash the muffin tin and when the tarts were cool I just put the tarts back into the tin, covered it with foil. They were easy to transport and I didn't have one problem with any of the little tarts braking or getting smashed one into another.
