This was proposed back in November but because of our meeting schedule it would not be voted on until the January meeting. Below is listed the ballot for the proposed change:
- > PLEASE CIRCLE YES OR NO IN FRONT OF THE PROPOSED CHANGE. THE PROPOSED CHANGE IS TO ELIMINATE THE THIRD SENTENCE UNDER MEMBERSHIP. IT IS UNDERLINED BELOW:
- > YES NO Membership in the club shall be restricted to owners, over the age of 18, of Corvette automobiles in drivable condition. Club membership will be limited to 100 regular memberships. Additional memberships will be approved by order of the Board. All Saint Louis Corvette Club members will be NCCC members and will be extended all of the rights and privileges offered by NCCC. Club members are required to attend club meetings and events to remain active members. These are outlined in Section 2: MEMBERSHIP STATUS.
- > The effect of this proposed change is to eliminate the Board's discretion to add additional regular members. Remember the current Board has already stated they do not envision growing our membership greater than the 100 regular members as called for in the by-laws.
- > Also don't forget about the upcoming Twelfth Night Of Christmas and Ugly Sweater Party to be held at the house of Mike and Karen Price on Friday, January 5. More details will be forthcoming.

Monthly newsletters are sent on the Internet. Notes from the meetings, pictures from events, articles of interest and future events are listed. Starting in 2017, newsletters will be available in cell phone/tablet and desktop PDF formats for easy reading.

Road Trips

Road trips may be a single day or extended multiple day events. Always be on time, have a full tank of gas and hit the restroom before starting a day on the road. The next rest stop may be a couple of hours away. Hand held radios for quick information/emergency announcements with large groups and cell phones for longer distance are used for communication. Trip sponsors will provide maps or instructions. Longer trips will have cell phone numbers.

If anyone has a problem, one additional car will stay behind and the rest of the group will continue.

Large group road trips will often break into smaller groups with 12 to 15 cars.

Sharp attention to driving is needed. Highway speed limits and right lane travel are recommended.

Courtesy in passing and merging back in takes judgement and timing. Crowding in front of a passed vehicle and slowing down may cause problems (road rage) especially with trucks. We do not have to travel bumper to bumper.

Radios for the Road

The Motorola MR350R radios are a good choice. They have a charging port which allows use and charging while driving. Batteries run out after hours on the road.

A USB MINI cable is needed. The mini plug has a "T" shape while the micro plug has a elliptical shape. The ANKER lighter port adapter has two outlets for charging a cell phone at the same time.
